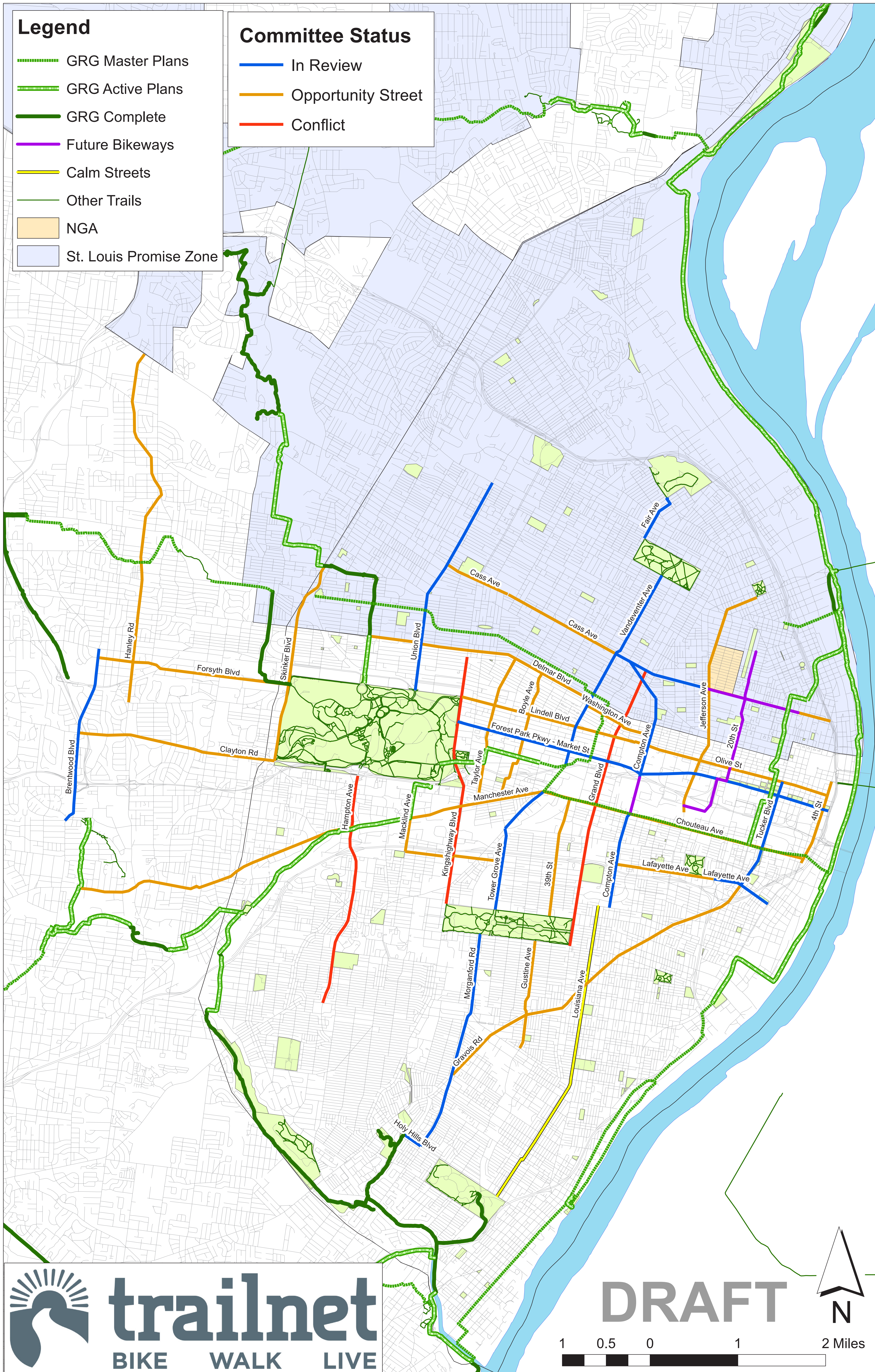

# TRAILNET VISION

## GROUND RULES

- 1. State views and ask genuine questions.** This enables the Committee to shift from monologues and arguments to a conversation in which members can understand everyone's point of view and be curious about the differences in their views.
- 2. Share all relevant information.** This enables the Committee to develop a comprehensive, common set of information with which to solve problems and make decisions.
- 3. Use specific examples and agree on what important words mean.** This ensures that all Committee members are using the same words to mean the same thing.
- 4. Explain reasoning and intent.** This enables Committee members to understand how others reached their conclusions and see where Committee members' reasoning differs.
- 5. Focus on interests, not positions.** By moving from arguing about solutions to identifying needs that must be met in order to solve a problem, this reduces unproductive conflict and increases the group's ability to develop solutions that the full Committee can support.
- 6. Test assumptions and inferences.** This ensures that the Committee is making decisions with valid information rather than with anecdotal stories and personal beliefs.
- 7. Discuss undiscussable issues.** This ensures that the Committee addresses the important but undiscussed issues that are hindering its results and that can only be resolved in a Committee meeting.
- 8. Jointly design next steps.** This ensures that everyone is committed to moving forward together as a Committee.
- 9. Confidentiality.** Committee members are expected to keep information confidential that may hinder the progress of the plan. If a Committee member is unsure if information is public knowledge then they are expected to check-in with Trailnet staff before sharing.
- 10. Transparency.** Trailnet plans to share appropriate information with the public to create a transparent planning process. Information may include sharing minutes from each of the committee meetings. Trailnet staff will ask for approval of minutes before sharing them publicly.

**Committee Member Expectations:** Committee members have been selected for their expertise and point of view. As such they will be asked to read best practices, relevant reports, and share knowledge about these topics. All committee members have pledged to abide by conflict of interest standards and the planning lens.





# TRAILNET VISION

## PLANNING LENS

### **For the Long Term:**

The vision will be designed to last in materials, financing, design, and environmental features. Places that are built to be loved are places that are preserved.

### **An Equitable St. Louis:**

The vision will support a St. Louis where outcomes are not determined by race, zip code, or class. The vision will serve as the backbone of a connected network that provides an opportunity for all St. Louisans to walk and bike safely, no matter where they live. When it comes to outreach, design, destinations, routes, affordability, and land-use policy, the planning process will seek decisions that support a more just community.

### **Healthy Communities:**

The vision will support mental and physical health for all users by making physical activity part of the community. Design and policy will make it easier and safer for people to be social, to exercise, and to develop local businesses that support community members.

### **Places Where People Come First:**

The vision will be designed to prioritize people over cars. When it comes to tradeoffs for signal timing, design, and right-of-way, it will prioritize people over moving or parking cars. When it comes to policies and design standards to support the vision, we will choose policies that improve city life for people and that provide an opportunity for true progress, rather than perpetuating the status quo.

### **A Thriving Local Economy:**

The vision will support streets friendly to small businesses. We will choose designs and policies that support mixed uses, affordable housing, local businesses, incremental development, and neighborhood growth by current residents.
